The Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem Revisited: Law, Science, and the Pursuit of Ecosystem Management in an Iconic Landscape



Thirty years ago, the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem (GYE) concept and ecosystem management surfaced as key to preserving this legally fragmented region's public lands and wildlife in the face of mounting development pressures. Yellowstone's grizzly bears were in sharp decline and wolves were absent from the landscape, while bison and elk management issues festered. The GYE's national forest lands were subject to extensive logging, energy leasing, and other commercial activities that cumulatively threatened the region's ecological integrity. In the face of extreme jurisdictional complexity and a strong commitment to agency discretion, a high-profile federal "Vision" effort to improve resource management practices cratered under intense political pressures. In the last

30 years, however, much has changed in the GYE.

At our January 14 Luncheon, our speaker, Bob Keiter, University Distinguished Professor of Law and Director of the Wallace Stegner Center for Land, Resources and the Environment, will outline the principal resource management issues confronting the GYE during the past thirty years. He will focus on national park, national forest, and wildlife management controversies as well as the emerging role of private lands in regional conservation efforts. He will also identify several difficult new problems including escalating park visitation, mounting recreation pressures, and climate change. In his conclusion, he will suggest how ecosystem management and related landscape conservation strategies can help address these problems.

AARP Tips on Avoiding Travel Scams

 Use credit cards because if you've been cheated, you may have recourse. Wire transfers and gift cards are like cash; once you've paid, it's hard to get your money back.



- Remember that <u>peer-to-peer payment apps</u> such as Venmo and Cash App should be used to send money only to people whom you actually know and trust.
- When you search on the internet, make sure you end up at legitimate websites. The top of the search results may include paid links with names very similar to an airline or other genuine travel site. Always buy directly from the airline or another vendor, such as a travel agent you know and trust.
- If you have doubts, search online for the name of the tour guide or company offering the deal along with the word "reviews" or "scam" to see what other consumers say.
- In many states, travel agents must register with the state attorney general or consumer department. If you're dealing with a new agent, ask where he or she is registered and look the agent up. For businesses, check them out with the Better Business Bureau.
- For rentals, check the reviews of other travelers and look up the location online.
- For hotels and airlines booked through a third party, check first with the provider to make sure the booking is real.
- Read the fine print on fees and cancellation policies.
- Compare an offer you're considering with other deals. That hotel room overlooking New York's Central Park for \$100 a night is probably a scam.
- [Travel with the Emeriti Club next May, and you can be sure you won't be scammed!]

The bottom line: If the deal seems too good to be true, it probably is.


