WHEN WOMEN WERE BIRDS: THE DANCE BETWEEN VOICE AND SILENCE TERRY TEMPEST WILLIAMS

Ms. Williams' presentation is reflective of her latest book, When Women Were Birds: Fifty Four Variations of Voice. (New York: Farrar, Straus, & Gilroux, 2012)



Terry Tempest Williams is currently the Annie Clark Tanner Scholar in Environmental Humanities at the University of Utah. Her writing has appeared in *The New Yorker, The New York Times, Orion Magazine,* and numerous anthologies worldwide as a crucial voice for ecological consciousness and social change. She and her husband, Brooke Williams, divide their time between Castle Valley, Utah and Jackson Hole, Wyoming.

Terry Tempest Williams has been called "a citizen writer," a writer who speaks and speaks out eloquently on behalf of an ethical stance toward life. A naturalist and fierce advocate for freedom of speech, she has consistently shown us how environmental issues are social issues that ultimately become matters of justice. "So here is my question," she asks, "what might a different kind of power look like, feel like, and can power be redistributed equitably even beyond our own species?"

Emeriti Tour to Prague, Vienna & Budapest

11-days / 10-nights

September 26 – October 6, 2013

We plan to visit three of the most beautiful cities in Europe; Prague, Vienna and Budapest, during a very pleasant time of the year. Crowds should be diminished by the end of September and the weather is still likely to be good. We'll spend three nights in each city with free time to make fun discoveries at our own pace.

Sightseeing highlights in Prague include visits to St. Vitus Cathedral, Prague Castle, Old Town Square and the historic Charles Bridge. We'll spend a half-day in Bratislava, capital of Slovakia, on our way to Vienna where we will view the Presidential Palace and the quaint Old Town section. In Vienna we'll have a guided tour of the Parliament, the Hofburg Palace, the Opera House and St. Stephen's Cathedral. In Budapest, we'll view the Chain Bridge and visit the UNESCO-listed Castle Hill district and Fisherman's Bastion.

Since Cheryll May, our trip organizer, is a former art museum curator, you can be sure that the art and architecture freaks in the group will have plenty of opportunities to enjoy the artistic treasures of each capital. The official tour guide will have many additional suggestions for the best restaurants, shopping, and other pursuits.

The base fee is \$2085.25 per person (double occupancy) plus airfare and mandatory trip insurance and airport transfers. The fee includes first-class hotel accommodations in all three cities, touring by luxury motor coach, a multi-lingual tour director, and local guides in Vienna and Budapest. It also includes 9 hot buffet breakfasts and 4 evening meals.
