By seeking out a diverse set of playwrights (more than half writers of color and more than half women), we hope to bring fresh voices and perspectives to the rigorous work of translation."

Tim Slover, a project contributor and a professor in the UU Theatre Studies Program,

teaches playwriting and dramatic literature. He is an accomplished playwright and screenwriter, whose works have been produced off-Broadway and in professional regional and university theatres all over the US, Canada, and UK. His writing awards are many, including being a finalist for a Television Arts and Sciences Community Service Emmy.

Dr. Slover's Play on! contribution is *The Two Noble Kinsmen*, produced jointly by the OSF and the UU Department of Theatre in 2017.

<u>A big Thank You</u>! to our enthusiastic Emeriti travelers! By Christmas we had filled all the space held for us for our tour, *Greece: Minoans to Pericles to Paul*.

On Day 5 of our upcoming tour to Greece en route from Thessaloniki to Kalambaka we are scheduled to stop in Veria to visit the Bema of Apostle Paul. I had to look up "bema" to find out that it is the altar/sanctuary of an Orthodox church; historically, it was the orator's platform in ancient Athems. While this memorial is not without interest, it *is* a modern one. Meantime,

seven miles southeast lies the UNESCO World Heritage site of Vergina and the Museum of the Royal Tombs of Aigai displaying the finds from the tomb of Philip II of Macedon, father of Alexander the Great, discovered in 1977. I am working to convince the tour company to drop those of us interested at the Museum while others go to see the Bema. (The entrance fee for the Museum, as of this moment, is 12€.) The more of us who are interested in going to Vergina the stronger will be the argument. 

Curiosity Cons

From the August 29, 2016 AARP Bulletin article, No-Talk Phone Scams

Knowing that you are likely to ignore unrecognized or private numbers on caller ID, today's crooks use software that allows them to display fake numbers that are hard to resist. Here are some variations.

- **The neighbor ploy** Your area code and prefix are displayed, so the call appears to be from a neighbor or nearby business. "Fewer people are comfortable blocking local numbers, increasing scammers' success rates," notes Jonathan Nelson of Hiya. And the bogus number makes it hard for law enforcement to track.
- The "Hey, there's a call from my own phone number" scam It's hard to resist answering a call from your own number, which scammers can simulate. And they are able to get around any call blocking that you've set up.
- The one-ring rip-off Criminals sometimes program auto-dialers to make repeated calls to you, each disconnecting after just one ring. They know this might spur you into calling back the displayed number to complain. There's double trouble if you call area codes such as 268, 664 and 876. These are for Caribbean countries and other places that have high per-minute phone charges. One scam involves getting you to call one of those numbers, then getting you to hold through transfers that rack up your bill until a scammer gets on the line and starts a fraudulent pitch.
