PREVENTING OPIOID OVERDOSE DEATHS: THE ROLE FOR NALOXONE RESCUE KITS



At our **April 9 luncheon**, **Dr. Jennifer Plumb**, will share her expertise on the opioid epidemic, opioid overdoses, and the use of Naloxone. Dr. Plumb earned her medical degree at the University of Utah, completed her residency in Pediatrics at Riley Hospital for Children/Indiana University, and completed a Fellowship in Pediatric Emergency Medicine at the U of Utah/Primary Children's Medical Center. She also holds a master's degree in Public Health. Dr. Plumb is board certified and an Associate Professor in both Pediatrics and Pediatric Emergency Medicine.

The National Center for Health Statistics reported in 2017 that more than 72,000 Americans died from drug overdoses, and the American Council on Science and Health observed that this figure is almost double the number of U.S. deaths from auto accidents and close to four times the number of homicides. U.S. overdose deaths specific to opioids numbered almost 50,000 that year. These staggering facts do not fully measure the devastation of this epidemic. Drug addiction and deaths engender a ripple effect which includes: families devastated emotionally, socially and financially; community services stretched thin; soaring demands on the criminal justice system; and the tragic loss of human life, promise, and potential contributions to society.

As a clinician and as the Medical Director of Utah Naloxone, Dr. Plumb is dedicated to increasing understanding of the opioid crisis and to preventing opiate overdose deaths with Naloxone. We look forward to having Dr. Plumb with us and to gaining a better understanding of this devastating and multi-faceted public health emergency.
