Choir Redux with another memorable performance YOU actually voted for.


Reformed in 2012 in honor of former faculty and accomplished choral arranger Bernell Hales, the 24-28 member U Chamber Dr. Choir maintains the high choral standards he set in his twenty years at the U. The choir covers a wide range of repertoire and styles, focusing on those that push choral music into new, exciting arenas.

Dr. Barlow Bradford is one of the leading conductors and composers in the country, perhaps the world. An associate professor of choral studies, Barlow holds The Ellen Nielson Barnes Presidential Endowed Chair

for Choral Studies in the School of Music.

As an orchestral and choral conductor, he cofounded the Utah Chamber Artists in 1991 which has attained international acclaim for its impec-

cable, nuanced performances. NPR's "First Act" – dedicated to choral music – featured Utah Chamber Artists performing with the Boston Pops and Utah Symphony. Many of Bradford's arrangements have been recorded by the Mormon Tabernacle Choir.



Bradford's doctorate in musical arts is from the University of Souithern California. Among his mentors are Gustav Meier, Robert Cundick and Gladys Gladstone.

Start here: The Missile Defense Agency (MDA), Ballistic Missile Defense System (BMDS) Operational Test Agency, Joint Functional Component Command for Integrated Missile Defense, and U.S. Pacific Command, in conjunction with U.S. Army soldiers from the Alpha Battery, 2nd Air Defense Artillery Regiment, U.S. Navy sailors aboard the guided missile destroyer USS Decatur (DDG-73), and U.S. Air Force airmen from the 613th Air and Operations Center, successfully conducted a complex missile defense flight test, resulting in the intercept of two medium-range ballistic missile targets. The flight test was planned more than a year ago, and is not connected to events in the Middle East. (OK, now breathe!)

Nova Scotia & Prince Edward Island

16 - 25 June 2015

Where there are red sand beaches, fishing villages, artist colonies; mountains, forests, coastal scenery with delightful picturesque lighthouses? Where you may explore a charming farmhouse straight out of literature, an inventor's retreat, and a mighty 18th century fortress? Scout for red foxes, blue herons, and the breaching of the whales? Day 6 – Cabot Trail, Baddeck – Cape Breton Highlands National Park, Pleasant Bay to Cape Smokey; visit Alexander Graham Bell Museum. B

Day 7 – Fortress of Louisbourg – 18th century French fortress; free time in Baddeck. BD

Day 8 – Peggy's Cove, Halifax – Canso Causeway to mainland; visit Mi'kmaq heritage center; artist & fishing village of Peggy's Cove; classic lighthouse; sightseeing in Halifax. B

Day 9 – Halifax – Stroll historic waterfront; visit Maritime Museum of the Atlantic; free time. BD

Day 10 – Halifax – Transfer to the airport for homeward flight. B

Meals: 9 breakfasts, 4 dinners included.

Land cost: \$1195 + \$199 in taxes & fees per person double occupancy = \$1394 ppdo

\$1729 + \$219 in taxes & fees for a single = \$1948 pp \$1075 + \$189 in taxes & fees for a triple = \$1264 pp

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: This tour company will <u>NOT hold group space</u>. Tours are booked on a first-come space-available basis. Travelers usually begin booking about six months out.
