# The University of Utah Chamber Choir Concert: Continuing Our Holiday Tradition



Join us on Wednesday December 4 at 12:00 noon (note the day and time change), for the seventh annual Emeriti Club concert by the University of Utah Chamber Choir. Dr. Barlow Bradford, Director, established the choir in 2010. In 2014, the choir garnered international acclaim by winning the Grand Prix de la Ville de Tours (Grand Prize of the City of Tours). Returning in 2015 to participate in the championship round amidst other winning choirs, they secured the Grand Prix European (European Grand Prize), often regarded as the world cup in amateur choral musicianship.

We are indeed fortunate to have this lauded choir with us again this year. A magical holiday experience is in store for Emeriti Club members. For the Choir's convenience, their performance will come before the entrée is served and, as stated above, will start promptly at 12:00 noon.

# Modest Increase in the Price of Emeriti Club Luncheons

Effective beginning with our January 14<sup>th</sup> luncheon, the cost of meals at our Emeriti luncheons will be \$18, an increase of \$1 per meal that is necessitated by rising food costs. Even this does not cover the actual cost of most of our meals. The difference is subsidized by income from dues paid by our members. Luncheons purchased by credit card will continue to have a 50-cent surcharge. Although dues are voluntary, we do encourage members to make their dues payments if they are able. They help support our activities in a variety of important ways and maintain the vitality of our Club. Please see the box below for more information about dues.

## **Emeriti Club Dues**

All who are named emeritus/a by the Trustees of the University of Utah automatically become members of the Professors Emeriti Club as do their spouses. Membership comes with no additional requirements. However, the Club does provide many benefits and, accordingly, solicits dues from members who wish to support our programs. Annual Dues are \$12.00 for an individual, \$24 for a couple, and can be paid when submitting the Luncheon Reservation Form at the end of each newsletter.

Member dues are one of two resources that support Club activities. The Academic Vice President's Office also provides a nominal annual stipend. The Club's Executive Board arranges a variety of ongoing activities, including monthly luncheons with special presentations by notable speakers; overseas trips; weekly hikes and additional multi-day outdoor activities; special events with the Utah Symphony/Opera, the University's School of Music, Pioneer Theatre, and more. Where applicable, special ticket prices include a small subsidy to make events affordable to all. The Club also produces a monthly newsletter throughout the academic year (eight issues) to keep members informed of all sponsored activities and events. And the Board continually advocates for emeriti faculty benefits and privileges. Your dues help support these activities and benefits.

# Consider This: Volunteering at the Geraldine E. King Women's Resource Center

As the holiday season approaches, we begin to think a lot about giving. This year consider a gift of time: serving a meal to the 200 otherwise homeless women living at the Geraldine E. King Women's Resource Center. It is one of three new centers serving the homeless in the Salt Lake area and one of two currently open.

The Center is run by the Volunteers of America (VOA). The brandnew building at 7th S and 131 E is lovely and full of light. It is an

impressive facility, serving a critical need in our community. Volunteers are needed to serve (not cook) meals. This is how VOA describes the volunteer program:

Our Meal Service Program invites individuals and mid-sized community groups to volunteer at our facility by helping with meal prep and service for up to 200 women, who are struggling with homelessness. As a meal service volunteer, you are providing positive community engagement and helping us meet the nutritional needs of the clients. Our kitchen facility can accommodate up to 20 volunteers at a time with plenty of tasks to keep everyone busy.
