

Some perceptive – and, yes, partisan – reflections from State Senator **Jim Dabakis** on a heated election session

Utah State Senator Jim Dabakis came to Utah from Massachusetts to go to college in 1971. He has called Utah home ever since.

Sen. Dabakis was involved in radio and television from 1976 to 1989. He worked for all three major network television stations in Salt Lake City as well as numerous talk radio

stations. He was recognized with national awards during his time

as a journalist and talk show host. Sen. Dabakis was known as "Mr. Democrat" during his 13 years on Utah talk radio.

Sensing an opportunity in 1989 with the imminent collapse of communism, Dabakis quit broadcasting and moved to Eastern Europe with his partner (now husband) Stephen. He spent most of the next two years in Russia, China and living abroad, while developing a business around his passion – art.

Dabakis is passionate about equality and was chair of the Utah Pride Center and founding chair of Equality Utah.



"I love Utah Democrats!"

After volunteering in Scott Matheson's first run for governor in1976, Sen. Dabakis has remained an active Democrat.

In 2011, he was elected chair of the Utah Democratic Party. He called that full-time job (it paid \$1 a year!) "one of the most engaging,

fun, challenging and exciting things I have ever done."

The next year, Sen. Dabakis

was chosen by his party delegates to serve out the remaining two years of Ben McAdams' unexpired term.

Running for a four-year term in 2014, Sen. Dabakis received 75 percent of the vote and managed to raise over \$146,000 for his campaign. Contributions came from more than 1,100 private citizens – a record number.

The busy senator serves on the Executive Appropriations and Rules Committees. He also is a member of the committees on Higher Education Appropriations, Education, Natural Resources, Agriculture and Environment, plus Revenue and Taxes.

The first non-acdemic book written by Dr. **Noel de Nevers** in what he calls his "retirement project" has been published and is available through local booksellers.

The book is titled "The Kolob Tragedy: The Lost Tale of a Canyoneeing Calamity."

The emeritus professor of chemical engineering has written three textbooks within his field, but was challenged to find a more poignant literary voice in telling the gripping story of a 1993 canyoneering outing in southern Utah that ended in tragedy.

In a recent book review, the professor told *The Salt Lake Tribune* it took him a while to break the habit of writing a science manual. Indeed, the first publisher to receive his draft curtly replied that it read "like an engineering textbook."

It wasn't an easy fix. After first investing years into research and telephone inter-

views, it took Dr. de Nevers a daunting 12 years of editing and other academic projects before he found a publisher willing to accept the manuscript.

Tom Jones, a noted canyoneer who has authored books on the sport, worked with Dr. de Nevers in honing the text into a more readable and publishable style.

Readers may now delve into the "lost" events that flesh out the story of how two leaders of an eight-member church group – three adults and five teenagers – drowned while rappelling into the waters of Kolob


Canyon. The rest of the group was trapped five days awaiting rescue.

A lawsuit involving the National Park Service and a county water conservancy district was settled out of court.


