MEN AGAINST MOUNTAIN

The gripping story of a harrowing 3-day rescue on Grand Teton

THE GRAND RESCUE, a documentary film recounting the legendary 1967 rescue on the North Face of the Grand Teton by Park Service res-

cuers, will be shown January 10 at the monthly luncheon. (See adjoining box for further parts of the presentation.)

Risking their lives to save a severely injured climber and his companion the

his companion, the rescue took three harrowing days and pushed the team to new abilities.

Each day, deprived of food and sleep, they battled the elements, unknown terrain, and an njured climber who believed the rescue was not being properly executed. The film utilizes re-creations from high on the mountain as well as modern day interviews with the rescued and the rescuers. The documentary exposes the tenuous relationship between man and the mountain and

an unprecedented rescue in American mountaineering.

Jenny Wilson is director/producer of THE

GRAND RESCUE. She is the daughter of Ted Wilson, Professor Emertus of Political Science who served on the 1967 Jenny Lake Ranger rescue team. Ted and his

role is featured in the film.

Inspired by the team members and the historic

rescue, Jenny was moved to share the story through a documentary film. Outside of her film life, she is a member of the Salt Lake County Council.

Today, Ted is executive director of UCAIR, a Utah clean air partnership. He also has been Salt Lake City's mayor and director of the Hinckley Institute.

Preamble: The state of the Nation has deteriorated. The

state of the Planet is rapidly deteriorating. The deterioration is due to the growth and actions of Humanity. Humanity itself is in peril. The State must change.

National and World leaders are trapped in a set of assumptions which exacerbate the very problems that must be solved.

Replacing those leaders and rulers is insufficient – the replacements will be afflicted by the same historic assumptions. The most effective, most pragmatic, most realistic solution is directly to change the mindsets of existing afflicted rulers and elected leaders.

Given the urgency of the problems which must be solved, those entrenched mindsets can only be

changed by direct chemical means – by chemically facilitated revelations and epiphanies.




