The Rocky Mountain Innocence Center: Actual Innocence and Wrongful Convictions in Utah

Jensie Anderson, a professor at the U of U College of Law and currently the Rocky Mountain Innocence Center (RMIC) Legal Director, will speak at our October 9 luncheon about the work of the RMIC in the Intermountain West and its place in the national innocence movement. The RMIC is a non-profit organization working to correct and prevent the wrongful conviction of innocent people in Utah, Nevada, and Wyoming. RMIC advocates for systemic reforms to improve our justice system and to create meaningful opportunities for the wrongfully convicted to prove their innocence and to receive compensation for their time spent behind bars. RMIC, in

coordination with the Innocence Clinic at the University of Utah, provides innocence investigation and litigation services entirely for free and has had six exonerations in its 18-year history.

Today we have an email list of over 100 people, but many are virtual hikers being reminded each week of places they had enjoyed! Emeriti Privileges

An Emeritus **identification card** entitles you to: **a**) discounts at the University Bookstore, **b**) reduced prices for season tickets to theatre and athletic events, **c**) faculty privileges in campus recreation programs, and **d**) free admission to the Museum of Natural History and Utah Museum of Fine Arts.

Beyond these opportunities, emeriti card holders are entitled to the following:

- Tuition-free enrollment in University and Osher Lifelong Learning classes (fees but no tuition).
- Free parking in campus Visitor lots. (*see immediately below for details)
- Half-price University parking permits through Commuter Services.
- Free admission for two to Preview Night performances of main stage productions at the Pioneer Theatre.
- Listing in the University General Catalog and the University Directory
- Discounts arranged by the Emeriti Club, such as the special activities published in the newsletter.
- *All lots are automated. Register your car license plate(s) (max. 2) with *alma.allred@utah.edu* at Parking Services. Provide your name, emeritus ID number and license plate(s). Parking is then a matter of entering the automated lots and leaving when you are finished.

Emeriti Club Dues

All who are named emeritus/a by the Trustees of the University of Utah automatically become members of the Professors Emeriti Club. Membership comes with no additional requirements. However, the Club does provide many benefits and, accordingly, solicits dues from members who wish to support our programs. Annual Dues are \$12.00 for an individual, \$24 for a couple, and can be paid when submitting the Luncheon Reservation Form found immediately below.

Member dues are one of two resources that support Club activities. The Academic Vice President's Office also provides a nominal annual stipend. The Club's Executive Board arranges a variety of ongoing activities, including monthly luncheons with special presentations by notable speakers; overseas trips; weekly hikes and additional multi-day outdoor activities; special events with the Utah Symphony/Opera, the University's School of Music, Pioneer Theatre, and more. Where applicable, special ticket prices include a small subsidy to make events affordable to all. The Club also produces a monthly newsletter throughout the academic year (eight issues) to keep members informed of all sponsored activities and events. And the Board continually advocates for emeriti faculty benefits and privileges. Your dues help support these activities and benefits.
