


Important Notice

Dr. Tom Miller, Chief Medical Officer at University of Utah Health, on COVID-19 in Utah



In an interview on the July 10 UU Scope Podcast, **Dr. Miller** was asked if, "this little simple cloth mask I have here, is this really the key to keeping the economy open, getting back to some normalcy and keeping other people safe?" Dr. Miller's response was, **"Yes, it is.** In fact, masks are the pill that we now have, right? We don't have a medicine you can take by mouth or a vaccine, but masks work. They help really reduce the rate of transmission. And if we're all wearing masks, it will really cut the contagion. It will cut the rate of infection."

Dr. Miller's many responsibilities give him a wide and deep perspective on COVID-19 and its effects on individuals and communities. As the University's CMO, he oversees a plethora of departments including System Quality, Patient Safety and Accreditation, Strategic Initiatives and Patient Experience, and Value Engineering. He also oversees Medical Information teams, the Medical Staff Office, Graduate Medical Education, and the Solid Organ Transplant service line. He directs over 200 employees, with the assistance of six associate Chief Medical Officers, six

Executive Medical Directors, and 26 Chief Value Officers.

Dr. Miller should also take a great deal of credit for the University of Utah Health's ranking in the top 10 in quality in the nation among academic medical centers based on costs, safety, patient satisfaction scores, and readmission rates. - > We recently learned from the Marriott Library that to bring access to online resources in compliance with licensing agreements, changes to the University's authentication system were made that require an active appointment and University ID. Up to 70% of emeriti may be affected by this update. If you have been unable to access the Library's online resources, you should contact your department's human resources representative and ask them to submit an active unpaid appointment ePAF that uses the emeritus job code 9230. If your department has questions about this, they may contact lan Godfrey at ian.godfrey@utah.edu. The Marriott Library is actively working with HR on a system wide update that will resolve access for all emeriti.
- Updates on **Duo and Umail** from University Information Technology (UIT).
 - Some emeriti have not been required to use **Duo** for accessing email, CIS, and other • accounts. That will soon change, and ALL emeriti must set up Duo to use these University services. Instructions for setting up Duo are available at https://bit.ly/3mMAq0D or as a link on the Emeriti Club website at <u>https://emeriti.utah.edu/</u> or Google "emeriti club Utah." Please note that you may not be aware that you are being checked for Duo.
 - UIT has changed its policy regarding emeriti having to "opt-in" annually to ensure access to Umail. Annual opt-in will not be required.
